Three Degrees is a multidisciplinary climate justice project, housed at the University of Washington School of Law. One of the first climate justice projects based at a US law school, Three Degrees harnesses the power of law to promote fair and equitable climate adaptation strategies in the regions of the world most vulnerable to climate impacts. Named after its formative gathering, The Three Degrees Conference on the Law of Climate Change and Human Rights, Three Degrees seeks to direct the creation of international legal strategies for climate justice.
